## Connecticut Milk Cost of Production Estimates for January, February, and March 2015

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June 1, 2015

Connecticut farm milk prices continued their downward spiral in the first quarter of 2015. The statistical uniform price for farm milk averaged \$16.78/cwt, more than \$7/cwt (approximately 30%) lower than a year ago. Meanwhile, the cost of production has remained stable at around \$33/cwt. Consequently, the minimum sustainable cost per cwt of milk exceeded prices by approximately \$10.10/cwt in the first quarter of 2015, triggering the need for payments to Connecticut dairy farmers under Public Act 09-229. Although milk prices appear to be stabilizing at the new lows and are even expected to increase slightly in the coming months, these trends continue to subject Connecticut dairy farmers to significant financial stress that can be partially mitigated by the continued implementation of Public Act 09-229.
